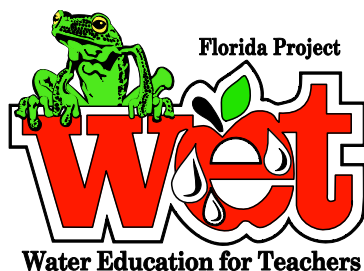

Directions to site: Camp Chowenwaw is a 153-acre site in Clay County at the mouth of Black Creek, near its confluence with the St. Johns River. It is located off U.S. 17 on Black Creek on Ball Road.

If coming from the north on U.S. 17, look for the Camp Chowenwaw sign after crossing the Black Creek Bridge. Turn right onto Ball Road.

If coming from the south, look for the camp sign before reaching Black Creek. Turn left onto Ball Road.
